



ArtsNL HALL OF HONOUR AWARD

Definition

The ArtsNL Hall of Honour Award recognizes a person, group or arts organization that has made a distinguished lifetime contribution to the cultural life of Newfoundland and Labrador. The Award comes with a piece of original art.

Residency Requirements

There is no residency requirement for the ArtsNL Hall of Honour Award, and the nominee does not have to be a native Newfoundlander or Labradorian.

Nominations

Members of the arts community and general public can nominate one person, group or organization. **Nominees will be considered only for the category in which they are nominated. Permission from the nominee is mandatory.**

Deadline: Nominations must be received by **Thursday, January 31, 2019**.

It is *strongly recommended* that the nominator seek letters of support for the nomination, which can be forwarded to ArtsNL by email (creid@nlac.ca) anytime before the nomination deadline by the nominee or letter author.

ArtsNL will contact nominees to request support materials, which will inform the Council's discussions.

Electronically submitted support material (PDF, JPG, links to video, etc.) must be uploaded **by the nominator using the ArtsNL online system**. (A username and password will be supplied to the nominee in the event they don't already have one.)

Voting and Selection

Appointees to the ArtsNL Hall of Honour are selected by members of Council who vote by secret ballot. In the event of a tie vote, the Chair has a second vote. If there are no nominees, or if those nominated do not qualify under the specified criteria, no award will be presented that year.

ArtsNL Hall of Honour appointments may be made posthumously.
